Dear Mr. Asay,

The Public Service Commission (PSC) has reviewed Union Telephone Company, Inc.'s ("Union") proposed revisions to Page No. 62 of its P.S.C. Utah No. 3 Tariff ("Tariff"), filed on June 9, 2022 (the "Filing"). Union submits the Filing in accordance with Federal Communications Commission (FCC) amended rules that implement 8YY access charge reform. Union indicates its proposed Tariff revisions reduce the relevant rates, as required by the FCC's 8YY access charge reform order ("Order"), and requests an effective date of July 1, 2022. As an initial matter, Union did not file its proposed Tariff revisions 30 or more calendar days before the requested effective date as required under Utah Admin. Code R746-405-1(C)(2). Nevertheless, the PSC is approving the proposed revisions, but reminds Union that such omissions in future filings might delay or prevent approval.

The PSC also reviewed the comments of the Division of Public Utilities (DPU) filed on June 14, 2022. DPU states the proposed revisions appear to comply with the FCC's Order and therefore recommends the PSC approve them, effective July 1, 2022.

Based on the PSC's review of Union's Filing, DPU's comments and its recommendation, the PSC approves Union's proposed revisions to its Tariff, as filed, effective July 1, 2022.
