Re: Docket No. 22-2287-01, *Business Telecom, LLC and CTC Communications Corp.'s Request to Cancel Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Provide Interexchange Telecommunication Services*

Mr. Aguirre,

The Public Service Commission (PSC) has reviewed the requests of Business Telecom, LLC (“Business Telecom”) and CTC Communications Corp. (“CTC”) to cancel certificates to provide interexchange telecommunication services (together, “Request”). The Request states that neither CTC nor Business Telecom has any customers or outstanding debts to any other carriers related to its Utah operations.

The Division of Public Utilities (DPU) filed comments on January 17, 2023, recommending the PSC take no action related to the Request. DPU explains that both Business Telecom and CTC operate under their parent company Windstream and neither has a certificate of public convenience and necessity (“CPCN”).¹

Based on the Request and DPU’s recommendation, the PSC intends to take no action in this docket unless a party files a request for agency action and explains the basis on which the PSC may or should act.
