Dear Ms. Slawson,

The Public Service Commission (PSC) has reviewed Carbon/Emery Telcom, Inc.'s ("Carbon") proposed revisions to Page Nos. 1-50 of its PSC Utah No. 2 Tariff ("Tariff"), filed on June 1, 2022 (the "Filing"). Carbon submits the Filing in accordance with Federal Communications Commission (FCC) amended rules that implement 8YY access charge reform. Carbon indicates its proposed Tariff revisions reduce the relevant rates, as required by the FCC's 8YY access charge reform order ("Order"), and requests an effective date of July 1, 2022. Carbon further makes corrections to the Tariff as detailed in its filing.

The PSC also reviewed the comments of the Division of Public Utilities (DPU) filed on June 13, 2022. DPU states it has no objections, the proposed revisions appear to comply with the FCC's Order, and therefore recommends the PSC approve them, effective July 1, 2022.

Based on the PSC's review of Carbon's Filing, DPU's comments and its recommendation, the PSC approves Carbon's proposed revisions to its Tariff, as filed, effective July 1, 2022.
