Recommendation (Acknowledge)

The Division of Public Utilities ("Division") has reviewed the notification of the Pro Forma Change of Control of Mobilitie, LLC., ("Mobilitie"). The public interest will be promoted by the Public Service Commission ("Commission") acknowledging this Change of Control.

The Division expects that, based on history that a filing of this type and with the information submitted by the company, there will be no objections or opposition to this recommendation. Therefore, the Division requests that this docket be adjudicated informally in accordance with R746-110-1.

Discussion

On or about September 27, 2022, Mobilitie notified the Commission of a transaction, which will result in a restructuring of the parent company, BAI Communications Group.

Mobilities is a registered Nevada limited liability corporation, headquartered at 660 Newport Center Drive, Suite 200, Newport Beach, CA 92660. Mobilitie received authorization to provide public telecommunications services on October 6, 2010, in Docket 10-2530-01.

The Applicant submits that the transaction described will serve the public interest and that the internal restructuring will involve only changes to intermediate entities, and thus will result in no change to, or impact Mobilitie.

The Applicants further submit that the transaction will be conducted in a manner that will be largely transparent their customers. The transaction will not result in a change of carrier for customers or any assignment of authorizations, and in no event will it result in the discontinuance, reduction, loss, or impairment of service to customers.

The Division recommends the Commission acknowledge this notice.
