1	PROCEEDINGS
2	March 25, 2024
3	HEARING OFFICER: Good morning, everyone. My
4	name is John Delaney. I am the Commission's designated
5	presiding officer for this hearing. Today is March 25th.
6	It's about 10 minutes after 9:00. This is the date and
7	time that is scheduled for the virtual hearing in Docket
8	23-2644-01, which is the Petition of IM Telecom, LLC d/b/a
9	Infiniti Mobile for designation as an eligible
10	telecommunications carrier in the State of Utah and to
11	participate in the Utah Universal Service Fund. We're here
12	to consider the settlement stipulation filed.
13	Let's begin with the report on the status of
14	counsel for the Office of Consumer Services.
15	MR. WARE: Our counsel had a medical
16	appointment this morning. So I apologize for the cross in
17	all of that there. I talked to Michelle and she was just
18	saying that we're happy to make the statement if the court,
19	or if the judge will allow us to. And if not, that's okay
20	too. It's up to you if you would like to swear me in.
21	HEARING OFFICER: Okay. I think this is how I
22	would like to proceed. We do have a settlement stipulation
23	that looks quite noncomprehensive. The parties have done a
24	lot of work to get to this point. We set up the hearing to
25	run this thing to ground. If the Office of Consumer

1	Services consents to proceed without counsel to provide the
2	testimony it otherwise would have provided at the direction
3	of counsel, the Public Service Commission is fine with
4	that.
5	MR. STEINHART: We are willing and happy to do
6	that.
7	HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Let's just park that
8	then and let's take it from the top and let's start with
9	appearances.
10	Mr. Steinhart, would you please make an
11	appearance for yourself and your witness please?
12	MR. STEINHART: Yes, Your Honor. This is Lance
13	Steinhart, the attorney for IM Telecom LLC d/b/a Infiniti
14	Mobile, business address 1725 Windward Concourse, Suite 150
15	in Alpharetta, Georgia, 30005.
16	HEARING OFFICER: And your witness today?
17	MR. STEINHART: I do not have a company witness
18	today. I was going to present on behalf of the company.
19	Do we need one? I didn't think we needed one.
20	HEARING OFFICER: This is we need sworn
21	testimony. This is a public hearing to address the
22	settlement stipulation that needs to be supported by
23	evidence.
24	MR. STEINHART: Can I get two minutes to get
25	somebody on the phone please?

1	HEARING OFFICER: Sure. Why don't I give you a
2	little bit more time just in case. Why don't we circle
3	back here by my computer in eight minutes which will be
4	9:20 a.m. Is that acceptable to everyone? We will be
5	adjourned for a moment. Thank you.
6	MR. STEINHART: Thank you.
7	(Off the record.)
8	HEARING OFFICER: Okay, everybody, if you'll
9	come back. Let's reconvene. We're back on in Docket
10	23-2644-01. We're here to consider the settlement
11	stipulation filed by the parties. We've had a few hiccups
12	along the way. Before we get started I do want to note two
13	things. One is that the parties requested a 9:00 a.m.
14	Monday, March 25th, hearing. The notice also requested and
15	directed the parties to have their witnesses available to
16	testify. We've now made it over the hump, so both of those
17	two things being somewhat problematic. I wanted that to be
18	on the record. And I would like to begin again with the
19	Applicant's appearance.
20	Mr. Steinhart, if you could just state your
21	name and then introduce your witness please.
22	MR. STEINHART: Thank you, Your Honor. I
23	apologize for the miscommunication this morning. This is
24	Lance Steinhart, again the attorney for IM Telecom LLC
25	d/b/a Infiniti Mobile. Our witness today is an authorized

1	representative of the company, John Ripley.
2	HEARING OFFICER: Thank you very much. For the
3	Division.
4	MR. GRECU: Patrick Grecu, assistant attorney
5	general representing the Division. The Division's witness
6	today will be Jonathan Lee.
7	HEARING OFFICER: Thank you very much.
8	Mr. Ware, we know that you are unrepresented by counsel in
9	this hearing today, but please introduce yourself.
10	MR. WARE: Yes, that is correct. My name is
11	Alex Ware and I am an analyst with the Office of Consumer
12	Services.
13	HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Just so you know
14	without the direction of your lawyer, we will go in this
15	order. We'll have the applicant go first. And then the
16	Division will be asked if they have any questions. The
17	Office will be asked if it has any questions, I'm assuming
18	that you will have none. The Division's witness will go.
19	The Applicant will then have an opportunity to ask any
20	questions if any, and as well as the Office will then have
21	the opportunity to ask questions, which again I assume they
22	won't.
23	Then, Mr. Ware, you will step up. I will swear
24	you in. You will provide your testimony and then be
25	subject to examination by Mr. Steinhart and Mr. Grecu.

1	MR. GRECU: Thank you for the instruction.
2	HEARING OFFICER: When we get to you we will
3	take it in baby steps. Wonderful. We're going to start
4	with the Applicant. I'm just going to refer to you as
5	Infiniti if that's okay.
6	MR. STEINHART: That will be great. Thank you.
7	HEARING OFFICER: Let me swear in your witness
8	and then you can proceed.
9	MR. STEINHART: Thank you, Your Honor.
10	HEARING OFFICER: Good morning, Mr. Ripley. My
11	name is John Delaney. Do you swear to tell the truth?
12	MR. RIPLEY: I do, yes, sir.
13	HEARING OFFICER: Mr. Steinhart, please
14	proceed.
15	DIRECT EXAMINATION
16	BY MR. STEINHART:
17	Q. Mr. Ripley, could you please state your name
18	for the record please?
19	A. John Ripley.
20	Q. Are you familiar with the application that was
21	filed in this docket?
22	A. I am, yes.
23	Q. Are you also familiar with the pretrial direct
24	testimony of Jason Welch that was filed in this docket?
25	A. I am, yes.
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1	Q. Would you like to other than the personal
2	information contained therein about Mr. Welch, would you
3	like to adopt his pretrial testimony as your testimony at
4	this point in time?
5	A. Yes, I would. Thank you.
6	Q. Is the information contained therein true and
7	correct in all material respects to the best of your
8	knowledge?
9	A. Yes, it is.
10	Q. Thank you. Are you also familiar with the
11	stipulation that was entered into in this proceeding?
12	A. Yes, I am.
13	Q. The company and you are supportive of such
14	stipulation and settlement?
15	A. Yes, that's correct.
16	Q. Thank you.
17	MR. STEINHART: Your Honor, I have no further
18	questions for Mr. Ripley at this point in time. I will
19	turn him over for cross examination.
20	HEARING OFFICER: Thank you very much. Back to
21	Mr. Steinhart's conclusion which leads us to the Division.
22	Any questions for Mr. Ripley?
23	CROSS EXAMINATION
24	BY MR. GRECU:
25	Q. I just have one item. I apologize if I missed
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1	this. Mr. Ripley, what is your position with the company?
2	A. I am an authorized representative of Infiniti
3	Mobile preparing their filings and testimonies on their
4	behalf.
5	Q. Thank you.
6	HEARING OFFICER: Mr. Ware, I'll give you the
7	opportunity to ask any questions if you have any.
8	MR. WARE: No questions. Thank you.
9	HEARING OFFICER: I do have a question.
10	Mr. Ripley, is your title within the company authorized
11	representative, or do you have a title?
12	MR. RIPLEY: No, sir. My title is authorized
13	representative. I hold an officer position, but the title
14	at this point in time is authorized representative.
15	HEARING OFFICER: Thank you. That's good
16	enough. That's all I have. Why don't we move to the
17	Division.
18	MR. GRECU: The Division would like to call
19	Jonathan Lee.
20	HEARING OFFICER: Good morning, Mr. Lee.
21	MR. LEE: Good morning.
22	HEARING OFFICER: Do you swear to tell the
23	truth?
24	MR. LEE: Yes.
25	HEARING OFFICER: Great. Thank you. You are
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1	sworn. Please proceed counsel.
2	DIRECT EXAMINATION
3	BY MR. GRECU:
4	Q. Mr. Lee, could you please state and spell your
5	name for the record?
6	A. Jonathan Lee, J-O-N-A-T-H-A-N, L-E-E.
7	Q. And by whom are you employed?
8	A. The Utah Division of Public Utilities.
9	Q. And your business address?
10	A. 160 East 300 South, Fourth Floor, Salt Lake
11	City, Utah, 84111.
12	Q. What is your position at the Division?
13	A. I'm a utility analyst.
14	Q. Could you provide a brief overview of your
15	educational background?
16	A. Yes. I have a bachelor's degree in electrical
17	engineering from the University of Utah and an MBA in
18	accounting from San Francisco State University.
19	Q. Can you please briefly describe some of your
20	work experience that is relevant to this docket?
21	A. Yes. I've worked at the Division since June of
22	2023. Prior to that I was the chief deputy auditor and the
23	chief deputy treasurer at Davis County for the previous 19
24	years. And prior to that I worked at the Division.
25	Q. Have you participated in this docket on behalf

1	of the Division?
2	A. Yes.
3	Q. Did you review the Company's petition,
4	supporting exhibits and pretrial testimony?
5	A. Yes.
6	Q. Did you also review the settlement stipulation
7	that is filed in this docket?
8	A. Yes.
9	Q. Is it the Division's position that the
10	settlement stipulation is just and reasonable and result?
11	A. Yes.
12	Q. Based on your knowledge and experience with the
13	Division, do you believe that approving the settlement
14	stipulation will be just, reasonable and in the public
15	interest?
16	A. Yes.
17	Q. Do you have a summary to share today?
18	A. I do.
19	Q. Please proceed.
20	A. Okay. The Division of Public Utilities, the
21	Division, recommends that the Public Service Commission
22	approve the stipulation and settlement agreement as filed
23	by IM Telecom LLC doing business as Infiniti Mobile with
24	the Division and the Office of Consumer Services, OCS.
25	On December 15, 2023, Infiniti Mobile filed
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1	with the Commission its petition for designation as an
2	eligible telecommunication carrier in the State of Utah and
3	to participate in the Utah Universal Fund. In support of
4	its petition Infiniti Mobile filed the direct testimony of
5	Jason Welch on January 11, 2024. The parties have reached
6	an agreement on the issues of this docket as set further in
7	the stipulation filed with the Commission on February 14,
8	2024.
9	There are several elements of this stipulation
10	that the Division would like to highlight for the
11	Commission.
12	Infiniti Mobile is a commercial mobile service
13	provider, radio service provider and a common carrier that
14	provides prepaid wireless telecommunication to consumers
15	using the underlying wireless network of AT&T Mobility LLC,
16	Verizon Wireless and T-Mobile USA Inc., the underlying
17	carriers on a wholesale basis.
18	Infiniti Mobile seeks designation as an
19	eligible telecommunication carrier, or an ETC, for the
20	purpose of receiving Federal Universal Service lifeline
21	support for qualifying Utah customers, federal enhanced
22	tribal universal lifeline support for qualifying Utah
23	costumers, and lifeline support from Utah Universal Service
24	Fund, the UUSF, for qualifying customers.
25	Infiniti Mobile meets the requirements for

Τ	federal ETC designation and for receiving state lifeline
2	support from the Utah Universal Service Fund.
3	In Exhibit 6 of its petition and attachment 1
4	included with the direct testimony, Infiniti Mobile
5	described three service plans that it proposed to offer in
6	Utah, which are identified as Plan 1, Plan 2 and Plan 3.
7	However, Plan 1 did not meet the federal or state minimum
8	service standards for lifeline plans.
9	To resolve this issue the Company agreed to
10	eliminate the noncompliant plan as an option for Utah
11	customers. Therefore, the stipulation set forth that
12	Infiniti Mobile will offer to low income customers two
13	plans that meet or exceed both the FCC's lifeline minimum
14	services standard and the Commission's Utah Universal
15	Service Fund plan requirement outlined in Commission Rule
16	R746-8-403.
17	Infiniti Mobile's plan for nontribal customers
18	include 3,000 voice minutes, unlimited text messages and
19	4.5 gigabit of data per month for a net cost to customers
20	of \$16 per month after application of lifeline and
21	universal service fund support. This includes the federal
22	and state discounts of \$9.25 and \$3.50 per month
23	respectively.
24	For tribal customers, Infiniti Mobile offers
25	3,000 voice minutes, unlimited text messages and 6 gigabits
	Page 13

of data per month with zero cost to the subscriber after the application of lifeline and Utah Universal Service Fund support.

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As discussed in the stipulation, Infiniti Mobile agrees to include an additional requirement in its provision of lifeline universal service offerings. First, Infiniti Mobile will use the Utah specific fact sheet and provide customers with concise and complete information about the services that they will receive. Second, Infiniti Mobile will comply with all applicable state service quality and consumer protection requirements. Third, Infinity Mobile acknowledges that approval of the petition and ongoing receipt of Utah Universal Service Fund support system on the verified payment of all applicable state and local regulatory fees, including, but not limited to universal service fees, emergent services and related services. Fourth, Infiniti agrees to adopt any changes to the certification and verification process required by the FCC by the Commission. Finally, if making any changes to its lifeline offering, Infiniti Mobile will timely file a notice with the Division and the Office describing the changed plans.

Because Infiniti Mobile meets the federal requirements for an ETC designation, Infiniti Mobile will follow all applicable service quality rules, pay all

1	applicable regulatory fees, offer services that meet or
2	exceeds the requirements outlined by the FCC and Commission
3	and have agreed to use its Utah specific fact sheet, it is
4	the Division's position that the stipulation is just and
5	reasonable and in the public interest.
6	The Division recommends that the Commission
7	approve the stipulation and settlement agreement as
8	submitted by the parties. And that concludes my summary.
9	Q. Thank you.
10	MR. GRECU: At this point, the Division would
11	like to move to admit the settlement stipulation filed on
12	March 19, 2024.
13	HEARING OFFICER: Thank you very much. Any
14	obligation to that motion?
15	MR. STEINHART: None from the Applicant. Thank
16	you.
17	HEARING OFFICER: Mr. Ware.
18	MR. WARE: None from the Office. Thank you.
19	HEARING OFFICER: Your motion is granted, the
20	stipulation is submitted.
21	MR. GRECU: I also would defer to Mr. Steinhart
22	if he wants to move to admit the Company's documents, if
23	not the Division can.
24	MR. STEINHART: I would like to move to admit
25	the Company's documents into the record at this time
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1	please.				
2	HEARING OFFICER: Would you identify what those				
3	documents are. Is it the				
4	MR. STEINHART: The testimony, the petition and				
5	the direct testimony and the stipulation.				
6	HEARING OFFICER: Direct testimony of Jason				
7	Welch, correct?				
8	MR. STEINHART: Correct.				
9	HEARING OFFICER: Any objection, Mr. Grecu?				
10	MR. GRECU: No objection.				
11	HEARING OFFICER: Mr. Ware, any objection to				
12	Mr. Steinhart's motion?				
13	MR. WARE: No objection.				
14	HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Your motion is				
15	granted, sir.				
16	MR. STEINHART: Thank you, Your Honor.				
17	MR. GRECU: At this point the Division's				
18	witness is available for cross examination and questions				
19	from the hearing officer.				
20	HEARING OFFICER: Thank you very much.				
21	Mr. Steinhart, any questions?				
22	MR. STEINHART: No questions. Thank you.				
23	HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Mr. Ware, any question				
24	for Mr. Lee?				
25	MR. WARE: None. Thank you.				
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1	HEARING OFFICER: I do have a couple of
2	questions. Mr. Lee, in your earlier narrative you talked
3	about a noncompliant plan. I'm summarizing. I'm not
4	trying to restate your testimony exactly. Bare with me.
5	But that there were three proposed plans at some point in
6	time, and at some point later in time it was determined
7	that only two of those three proposed plans were going to
8	be acceptable. Therefore, one plan was eliminated.
9	I got a little confused because I see in the
10	settlement stipulation that there is something referred to
11	as Plan 1. Maybe I took your narrative as the first
12	proposal that was eliminated was Plan 1. So where again do
13	I see in the stipulation that what was not good for the
14	stipulation is reflected, if at all?
15	Let me restate that. I'm sorry. I'm kind of
16	rambling. I thought you said that the plan that was not
17	compliant was eliminated. Is that accurate?
18	MR. LEE: Correct.
19	HEARING OFFICER: And therefore, that
20	elimination is not reflected in the settlement stipulation;
21	is that right?
22	MR. LEE: Correct. It was for background
23	information because as originally filed Infiniti Mobile had
24	Plan 1, Plan 2, Plan 3. Okay. As stipulated Infiniti
25	Mobile has Plan 1 and Plan 2. So we just wanted to clarify
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1	that this Plan 1 on the stipulation is not the same plan
2	that was originally filed.
3	HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Thank you. That helps
4	my confusion because I correlated that Plan 1 term in the
5	settlement stipulation itself to what you had said in your
6	narrative and I was confused as to why it was in there and
7	why a negative would be in the settlement stipulation.
8	MR. LEE: Correct.
9	HEARING OFFICER: You clarified that for me,
10	and I'll put a bow on it by saying that the stipulation as
11	presented and agreed to by the parties reflects that the
12	noncompliant plan is not part of the stipulation, correct?
13	MR. LEE: Correct, yes.
14	HEARING OFFICER: Okay. I will circle back on
15	this one with Infiniti's witness. I'll recall him later.
16	But yes, I have nothing further. Does anybody have any
17	follow-up based on my questions for Mr. Lee? Great. Thank
18	you for clarifying that for me, Mr. Lee. I appreciate it.
19	MR. LEE: You're welcome.
20	HEARING OFFICER: Now Mr. Ware, it's your turn.
21	I'll swear you in. Do you swear to tell the truth today?
22	MR. WARE: I do. Thank you.
23	HEARING OFFICER: Thank you very much. Please
24	proceed with your summary.
25	MR. WARE: Thank you, yes. I have a prepared
	Page 18

summary this morning. IM Telecom doing business as Infiniti Mobile petitioned in this case to be designated as an eligible telecommunications carrier with a lifeline offering in the State of Utah and to participate in the Utah Universal Service Fund. In its application IM Telecom states that it is not eligible for and is not seeking access to the funds from the Federal Universal Service Fund. IM Telecom's initial application stated that the Company planned to have three lifeline offerings in Utah. However, the OCS noted that the first offering did not meet minimum service requirements. Through negotiations, IM Telecom agreed to withdraw that first offering. Remaining is that IM Telecom will have a Utah lifeline program offering 3,000 voice minutes, unlimited text messages and 4.5 gigabits of data each month for \$16 for nontribal customers, which meets or exceeds the minimum requirements for the wireless telecommunications provider to receive lifeline funds. In addition to that offering of unlimited text messages each month meets Utah specific requirements and adds value for potential lifeline

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customers in Utah.

IM Telecom will also offer tribal customers
3,000 voice minutes, unlimited text messages and 6 gigabits
of data monthly at zero cost.

1	The Office believes that the stipulation before
2	the Commission is just and reasonable and results in the
3	public interest and recommends that the Commission approve
4	it.
5	That concludes my summary. Thank you.
6	HEARING OFFICER: Thank you very much, Mr. Ware
7	Mr. Steinhart, do you have any questions for Mr. Ware?
8	MR. STEINHART: No, Your Honor. Thank you.
9	HEARING OFFICER: Thank you. Mr. Grecu, any
10	questions?
11	MR. GRECU: No questions. Thank you.
12	HEARING OFFICER: Okay. I don't have any
13	questions either for Mr. Ware. But I do want to follow up
14	with a question of Mr. Ripley. Mr. Ripley, are you still
15	available?
16	MR. RIPLEY: Yes, sir.
17	HEARING OFFICER: Great. In the settlement
18	stipulation itself, Mr. Lee's testimony or narrative
19	touched on this, he talked about the initial terms that
20	Infiniti has agreed to pursuant to this stipulation, which
21	in the stipulation itself is paragraph 12, and it's items A
22	through F upper case. Mr. Lee's testimony seemed to recite
23	those as what Infiniti is agreeing to do. Do you have the
24	stipulation in front of you, Mr. Ripley?
25	MR. RIPLEY: Unfortunately not. I'm sitting on

1	a plane getting ready to take off. I apologize.					
2	HEARING OFFICER: Well, you heard his					
3	testimony, Mr. Lee's testimony. And Mr. Lee's testimony					
4	was that Infiniti agrees to those items, which in the					
5	stipulation itself is A through F. Mr. Lee used numerical					
6	designations 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6. Do you recall that					
7	testimony?					
8	MR. RIPLEY: I do, yes, sir.					
9	HEARING OFFICER: And do you concur with					
10	Mr. Lee's testimony on that point?					
11	MR. RIPLEY: Yes, I do.					
12	HEARING OFFICER: Okay. And the reason I'm					
13	asking you that, just so you all know, because the sentence					
14	that precedes those six requirements say that the parties					
15	recommend that Infiniti's provision of its universal					
16	service offerings as ETC shall be governed by, and then					
17	what follows is an agreement, an agreement, an agreement.					
18	So I was confused by the term recommend. I would think the					
19	term would be agreement, but it doesn't matter because					
20	Mr. Lee testified and Mr. Ripley just testified in					
21	concurrence with Mr. Lee's testimony, so I think we're					
22	fine. I just got confused by why parties are recommending					
23	what is already agreed to. But I think I've cleared that					
24	up. Anybody have any questions on that?					
25	MR. GRECU: No, Your Honor.					

1	MR. STEINHART: No. Thank you, Your Honor.
2	HEARING OFFICER: Wonderful. That's all I have
3	for Mr. Ripley and nothing further for Mr. Lee or for
4	Mr. Ware. Does anybody have anything further?
5	MR. GRECU: Nothing further from the Division.
6	MR. STEINHART: Nothing from the Applicant.
7	HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Thank you very much
8	for the work you did to get us to this point. Thank you
9	for being here today. We will be adjourned.

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# Utah Rules of Civil Procedure Part V. Depositions and Discovery Rule 30

(E) Submission to Witness; Changes; Signing.

Within 28 days after being notified by the officer that the transcript or recording is available, a witness may sign a statement of changes to the form or substance of the transcript or recording and the reasons for the changes. The officer shall append any changes timely made by the witness.
