ORDER CANCELING CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY

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ISSUED: February 21, 2025

On January 13, 2025, Bresnan Broadband of Utah, LLC ("Bresnan") filed a verified application with the Public Service Commission (PSC) requesting to cancel Bresnan's certificate of public convenience and necessity ("CPCN") to provide local exchange services in and around Cedar City, Utah (the "Application"). Bresnan asserts it has no customers in the Cedar City exchange. On that same date, the PSC requested the Division of Public Utilities (DPU) to review the Application and provide recommendations regarding the same. DPU filed its comments on February 5, 2025.

DPU's comments represent that its review of Bresnan's annual reports for the past several years confirm Bresnan's claim of zero customers. DPU indicates that Bresnan has complied with the PSC rules related to canceling a CPCN under Utah Admin. Code R746-350 and therefore recommends the PSC grant Bresnan's Application.

Based on the PSC's review of the Application and DPU's recommendation, and since no opposition was filed, the PSC finds cancellation of Bresnan's CPCN is in the public interest and approves the Application. Accordingly, Bresnan's CPCN, issued on

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September 26, 2007, in Docket No. 07-2476-02, is canceled, effective on the date of this order.

Notice of Opportunity for Agency Review or Rehearing

Pursuant to Utah Code Ann. §§ 63G-4-301 and 54-7-15, a party may seek agency review or rehearing of this written order by filing a request for review or rehearing with the PSC within 30 days after the issuance of the order. Responses to a request for agency review or rehearing must be filed within 15 days of the filing of the request for review or rehearing. If the PSC fails to grant a request for review or rehearing within 30 days after the filing of a request for review or rehearing, it is deemed denied. Judicial review of the PSC's final agency action may be obtained by filing a Petition for Review with the Utah Supreme Court within 30 days after final agency action. Any Petition for Review must comply with the requirements of Utah Code Ann. §§ 63G-4-401, 63G-4-403, and the Utah Rules of Appellate Procedure.
