Re: **Docket No(s). 26-2536-01 and 26-2656-01:** Notice Regarding a Pro Forma Assignment of Certain Assets of Zayo Group, LLC to Zayo Network Services, LLC.

Recommendation (Acknowledge)

The Division of Public Utilities (“Division”) has reviewed the notification and recommends that the Public Service Commission (“Commission”) acknowledge the notice of the pro-forma internal restructuring of Zayo Group, LLC (“Zayo Group”) and its subsidiary Zayo Network Services, LLC (“Zayo NS” together the “Applicants”).

Discussion

On or about January 16, 2026, Zayo Group and Zayo NS filed a notice with the Commission of a pro-forma internal restructuring.

The Applicants are Delaware limited liability companies headquartered at 1401 Wynkoop Street, Suite 500, Denver CO. 80202. Zayo Group was issued a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (“CPCN”) to provide public telecommunications services in the



State of Utah by the Commission on March 10, 2011, in Docket No. 11-2536-01. Zayo NS was issued a CPCN to provide public telecommunications services in the State of Utah by the Commission on November 03, 2025, in Docket No. 25-2656-01.

Zayo NS is an indirect, wholly owned subsidiary of Zayo Group. Zayo Group is a direct, wholly owned subsidiary of Zayo Group Holdings, Inc.

In the Applicants notice it states that internal restructuring will consist of reorganization of certain assets, infrastructure, and assignment of customers. It goes on to state that the reorganization will involve the transfer of high-capacity bandwidth and enterprise operations from Zayo Group to Zayo NS.

The Applicants state that the restructuring will be in the public interest and will not result in any changes in the rates or interruption to the services provided by the companies. A sample of the notice that was or will be sent out to customers that will be affected by this change was attached as Exhibit B in the Applicants filing.

Conclusion

The Division has reviewed the notice filed by Zay Group and Zayo NS for the pro-forma restructuring and concludes that it is in compliance with Utah Rule §54-8b-3.4; therefore, the Division recommends the Commission acknowledge this notice.
