Re: Docket Nos. 26-2543-01 & 26-2560-01, *Notice of a Change of Control of Spectrotel of the West, LLC and AireSpring, Inc.*

Dear Mr. Brill:

The Public Service Commission ("PSC") reviewed the joint notice filed by Spectrotel of the West, LLC ("Spectrotel") and AireSpring, Inc. ("AireSpring") on May 22, 2026 (the "Notice"). Spectrotel and AireSpring (together, the "Parties") jointly notified the PSC of their intention to transfer control of Spectrotel from Grain Management, LLC to Charlesbank Capital Partners, LLC through Spectrum Aggregator, LP's direct acquisition of the majority of equity interests in Spectrotel Ultimate Holdings, LLC, Spectrotel's parent company. Concurrently, control of AireSpring will transfer to Charlesbank Partners, LLC through Spectrotel Ultimate Holding LLC's concurrent indirect acquisition of all the equity interests of AireSpring (the "Transaction").

According to the Parties, the Transaction will not entail the combination, merger, or consolidation of Spectrotel with AireSpring, and thus believe PSC approval of the Transaction is unnecessary. Accordingly, the Parties request PSC acknowledgment of the Notice, or if the PSC deems it necessary, any necessary approvals. The Parties represent the Transaction as promoting the public interest by

bolstering Spectrotel's financial resources and management expertise and the concurrent affiliation with AireSpring as generating operational efficiencies.¹

The PSC also reviewed the Action Request Response filed by the Division of Public Utilities ("DPU") dated June 11, 2026. DPU states it has reviewed the Notice and the included details for the transfer of control, concludes that the Parties comply with Utah Admin. Code R746-349-7, and recommends the PSC acknowledge the Notice.²

No party has identified a statutory or other legal requirement for the PSC to approve the Transaction, and no party has requested a declaratory ruling on the issue pursuant to Utah Admin. Code R746-101-1, et seq. Accordingly, the PSC acknowledges that the Notice was filed and gives notice it will take no further action in the referenced dockets unless a party files a request for agency action and explains the basis on which the PSC may or should act.
