Re: Docket No. 26-2608-01- *Crown Castle Fiber LLC – Notification Regarding the Transfer of Control of Crown Castle Fiber LLC from Crown Castle Operating Company to Small Cells HoldCo Inc.*

All,

The Public Service Commission (PSC) has reviewed the Notice (“Notice”) filed on February 26, 2026, by Crown Castle Fiber LLC (CCF), Crown Castle Operating Company, and Small Cells HoldCo Inc. concerning a transfer of control (the “Transfer”) of CCF to Small Cells HoldCo Inc.

The Notice represents that the Transfer serves the public interest by restructuring the relevant network business into discrete fiber network and small cells segments. This transition is expected to result in more efficient and streamlined operations. Furthermore, the Notice emphasizes that the transition will be seamless for existing customers with no immediate changes to the rates, terms, and conditions

of service. The Notice asserts that because CCF is a competitive entrant that does not receive high-cost support from the Utah Universal Public Telecommunications Support Fund, the Transfer is exempt from PSC approval requirements pursuant to applicable state regulations.

The Division of Public Utilities (DPU) filed comments on March 20, 2026, confirming that CCF maintains a valid Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide public telecommunications services in Utah. DPU concludes that the Notice complies with Utah Code Ann. § 54-8b-3.4 and recommends that the PSC acknowledge the Notice.

No party has identified a statutory or other legal requirement for the PSC to approve the Transfer, and no party has requested a declaratory ruling on the issue pursuant to Utah Admin. Code R746-101-1, et seq. Accordingly, the PSC acknowledges that the Notice was filed and gives notice it will take no further action in the referenced docket unless a party files a request for agency action and explains the basis on which the PSC may or should act.
