PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The subject price list pages were filed with the Commission August 9, 2000. They were referred to the Division of Public Utilities, Utah Department of Commerce (DPU), for review and recommendation. The DPU filed its memorandum August 10, 2000, recommending suspension of the tariff on the basis that there is a factual issue as to whether the offering really represents a new telecommunications product as represented by the petitioner, Qwest Corporation. Based on the DPU's recommendation, we enter the following

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that:

- The Qwest price list pages accompanying the advice letter dated August 9, 2000, be, and they are, suspended pending further investigation and Order of the Commission.
- Any person aggrieved by this Order may petition the Commission for review within 20 days of the date of this Order. Failure so to do will forfeit the right to appeal to the Utah Supreme Court.
