SYNOPSIS

The Commission's jurisdiction in this matter appearing to be extremely limited, the Commission dismissed the same as not justifying the expense and time of a hearing.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Complainant above-named filed his complaint February 14, 2000. Initially the Commission ordered a hearing in this matter, but our further review of the supporting documentation for the complaint indicates that only one call within the State of Utah, for an amount of \$1.20, is arguably within our jurisdiction. All other calls for which Complainant disclaims responsibility are interstate or international, and thus fall within the jurisdiction of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and not this Commission.

The amount of \$1.20 is insufficient to justify the expense to the parties or the Commission of convening a hearing in this matter. We conclude our previous Notice of Hearing should be vacated and this matter dismissed. Accordingly, on our own motion, we enter the following

ORDER

WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

the complaint of NOSHAH ALI against AT&T COMMUNICATIONS, INC., be, and the same hereby is, dismissed.

If NOSHAH ALI wishes to proceed further, NOSHAH ALI may file a written petition for review within 20 days of the date of this Order. Failure so to do will forfeit the right to appeal to the Utah Supreme Court.
