ORDER

ISSUED: July 6, 2001

By The Commission:

On June 5 and 29, 2001, Qwest submitted, for Commission review and approval, various revisions to the company's tariff. The revisions are associated with the switched access tariff dealing with jurisdictional reporting requirements and the unbundling of common channel access capability signaling (CCSAC). The specific changes were detailed in advice letters 2001-17 and 2001-21, respectively. Even though these changes were submitted on different dates the issues are interrelated. Therefore, the Commission will treat them jointly.

On July 6, 2001, the Division of Public Utilities (Division) filed its memorandum concerning Qwest's proposals. It recommends these filings be suspended pending further investigation. The Division's recommendation is made because (1) the tariff changes fail to adequately address the issue of third-party vendor impacts, and (2) the tariff changes are incomplete regarding the methodology needed to determine the division of local, intrastate, and interstate services.

We suspend the tariffs contained in Advice letters 2001-17 and 2001-21 for the reasons articulated in the Division's memorandum. We direct that the Division, Qwest, and any other legitimately affected parties meet to resolve the issues outline in this Order and the Division's memorandum.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that Qwest's tariff revisions contained in Advice letters 2001-17 and 2001-21, are suspended in their entirety.
