PROCEDURAL HISTORY

On February 1, 2001, Petitioner Citizens Communications Company filed its Petition seeking a name change to CITIZENS LONG DISTANCE COMPANY. The matter was referred for review and recommendation to the Division of Public Utilities, Utah Department of Commerce (DPU), which filed its memorandum recommending approval on March 29, 2001. Since there appears to be no detriment to the public interest, and an evidentiary hearing on the matter would appear to be wholly superfluous, we have determined to dispose of the matter summarily. Accordingly, we enter the following

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that:

- The proposed name change is approved and that the records of the Commission be amended to reflect the holder of Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 2218 to be CITIZENS LONG DISTANCE COMPANY.
- Any person aggrieved by this Order may petition the Commission for review within 20 days of the date of this Order. Failure so to do will forfeit the right to appeal to the Utah Supreme Court.
