2	OFFICER HAMMER: Good afternoon,
3	everyone. This is the time and place noticed for a
4	public witness hearing in the Application of
5	Community Water Company for Approval of General Rate
6	Increase and Special Charge for Major Plant
7	Upgrade/Repair. That's Commission Docket
8	No. 17-098-01. My name is Michael Hammer and I am
9	the Commission's designated presiding officer for
10	this docket.
11	Looking around the room, I see
12	representatives from the Division of Public
13	Utilities and no one else. Does the Division have
14	any remarks it would like to make at the public
15	witness hearing?
16	MS. SCHMID: The Division does not
17	have any remarks.
18	OFFICER HAMMER: Okay. And I
19	understand that there are some individuals on the
20	phone as well.
21	MR. LANGE: That's correct. I'm
22	Terry Lange. I'm an intervenor, or course, in the
23	rate case and was unable to participate via phone
24	this morning during the hearing, so I'm calling in
25	now, I guess, as a general public and, perhaps, an
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1	intervenor also, to have a couple of comments.
2	OFFICER HAMMER: And who else do we
3	have on the phone?
4	MS. MILLER: My name is
5	Leanne Miller. I'm with the Hidden Creek
6	Homeowner's Association. I also have been an
7	intervenor in the rate case, but could not
8	participate this morning via phone, so I'm calling
9	in.
10	OFFICER HAMMER: Is there anyone
11	else? All right. Mr. Lang, we'll start with you.
12	MR. LANGE: So I want to thank
13	everyone, of course, for all the hard work that
14	you've done, everyone's done, on this whole thing,
15	and hopefully we can bring this to a conclusion
16	sooner rather than later.
17	As we all know, there's an annexation
18	about to happen. I'm quite confident that will
19	happen. I have testified in front of the Summit
20	County council about how the majority of the
21	customer base that the HOAs consist of are for the
22	annexation. So, with that being said, the testimony
23	rendered earlier today by Scott Savage indicating
24	that extra monies collected through the rate with
25	the 6,000-gallon tiers, that that be returned back

Page 5 1 to customers as an overpayment because work is not 2 going to be done. Work will not be going forward 3 with tank building. I'm quite confident of that. 4 So if that were to happen, the annexation goes through, then that money would be refunded. 5 money is not refunded, it should go with the 6 customer base over to Mountain Regional, rather than 7 8 what Larry white was suggesting. 9 Mr. White was suggesting that it be 10 used to satisfy monies that were spent in the past 11 that were not covered by the -- I guess, the rate 12 increase -- whether it be two years ago, three years 13 ago, however long ago he was thinking. I don't 14 think it's quite right. If the money were to go 15 with the customer base over to Mountain Regional, it 16 would not change the amount of the loan; it would only change the term of the loan. In other words, 17 rather than a 20-year bond, 20-year loan, it might 18 shorten the length of time by several months or 19 20 maybe a year, depending on what the dollar amount 21 is, but that would not benefit any of the current 22 customers right now who would be paying the higher 23 rate for the next several months. 24 So that's my comment, and hopefully that's all understood, what I'm talking about. 25

Page 6 That's all I have to say. 1 2 MS. SCHMID: I have a comment I'd 3 like to make, if I may. Mr. Savage was not sworn as 4 a witness this morning. He participated as an attorney and his testimony, I believe, thus he had 5 6 no testimony before the Commission. I just wanted 7 to let you know that, or no sworn testimony before the Commission. 8 OFFICER HAMMER: That's consistent 9 10 with the PSC's view. 11 MS. SCHMID: Okay. Thank you. 12 OFFICER HAMMER: Ms. Miller. 13 MR. LANGE: So --14 OFFICER HAMMER: I'm sorry, Mr. Lange. Were you not finished? 15 16 MR. LANGE: Does that weigh in on what I'm saying here or is it just a correction? 17 OFFICER HAMMER: I believe Ms. Schmid 18 19 just wanted to clarify that issue for you. 2.0 MR. LANGE: Okay. I appreciate that. 21 Thank you. 2.2 OFFICER HAMMER: Thank you, Mr. Lange. Ms. Miller. 23 24 MS. MILLER: Thank you. And I do want to thank everybody who's been involved in this 25

Page 7 whole rate case because it has been a lot of work 1 2 for many, many people. But it is very important to 3 the customer base that we get a resolution and move 4 on with getting some stability into our water 5 company. 6 I echo what Terry Lange just said regarding the increase in water rates. If it's used 7 8 for current operations that's one thing, but if it 9 just is being collected and not being spent for the current customers, I think that that's wrong. 10 11 I'd like to see there be some conditions set on 12 money and how it will be spent, either it's spent on 13 current operations and improvements, or it's transferred over to Mountain Regional once that 14 15 annexation is complete. And that's my only comment. 16 OFFICER HAMMER: All right. Let me 17 ask you, Mr. Lange and Ms. Miller, are you aware of 18 anyone else from your associations or any other customers who might have an interest in appearing 19 20 and speaking today or who intend to? 21 MR. LANGE: I know of no one. 2.2 MS. MILLER: I'm not aware of anyone 23 either. 24 MR. LANGE: If I may add this, 25 please. I neglected to say that I am the president
