ORDER CANCELING CERTIFICATE OF
PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY

ISSUED: March 14, 2018

On January 11, 2018, White Hills Water Company (“WHWC”) filed a letter with the Public Service Commission (“PSC”), explaining it was transferring all infrastructure and water rights necessary to provide service to its customers to Eagle Mountain City, representing Eagle Mountain City intended to commence providing water utility service to WHWC’s customers, and requesting the PSC cancel WHWC’s Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (“CPCN”), effective March 1, 2018.

On February 8, 2018, the Division of Public Utilities filed a memorandum, confirming the following: (1) WHWC has 131 water connections, which include 121 existing connections, two prepaid connections and eight committed connections for vacant lots; (2) WHWC will transfer its infrastructure and water rights to Eagle Mountain City at which time former WHWC customers will join the city’s much larger customer base; (3) rates for WHWC customers will remain the same or, potentially, be reduced subsequent to the city’s upcoming rate-study; and (4) the transfer of WHWC’s customers to Eagle Mountain City is in the public interest.

Based on the foregoing and there being no opposition, the PSC finds cancelation of WHWC’s CPCN and transfer of its customers to Eagle Mountain City is in the public interest. Accordingly, CPCN No. 2766, which was issued to WHWC on August 12, 1994, is canceled, effective March 1, 2018.

Notice of Opportunity for Agency Review or Rehearing

Pursuant to Utah Code Ann. §§ 63G-4-301 and 54-7-15, a party may seek agency review or rehearing of this written order by filing a request for review or rehearing with the PSC within 30 days after the issuance of the order. Responses to a request for agency review or rehearing must be filed within 15 days of the filing of the request for review or rehearing. If the PSC fails to grant a request for review or rehearing within 20 days after the filing of a request for review or rehearing, it is deemed denied. Judicial review of the PSC's final agency action may be obtained by filing a Petition for Review with the Utah Supreme Court within 30 days after final agency action. Any Petition for Review must comply with the requirements of Utah Code Ann. §§ 63G-4-401, 63G-4-403, and the Utah Rules of Appellate Procedure.
