Pursuant to Utah Code Ann. § 52-4-207, on this July 13, 2020, the chair of the PSC makes this written determination that, due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the continued risks of transmission in Utah, the hearing scheduled for **Wednesday, July 29, 2020, beginning at 11:00 a.m.** and the Public Witness hearing scheduled for **Wednesday, July 29, 2020, beginning at 1:00 p.m.** will be conducted as electronic meetings without an anchor location. An anchor location would provide a substantial risk to the health and safety of those who may be present at the anchor location. Participants should use the following bridge number: 720-279-0026 or 877-820-7831 and the following passcode: 249364. All parties for the hearing must have their witnesses in attendance and prepared to testify. The Public Witness hearing will continue until all present individuals have had a reasonable opportunity to address the PSC. Individuals planning to address the PSC at the Public Witness hearing must be present by 1:00 p.m.

The PSC may limit remarks that are unduly repetitious at the Public Witness hearing. The PSC desires to provide an opportunity for all individuals who desire to speak to do so. As such, the PSC may limit the length of individuals' remarks. Any individual wishing to present a statement of position to the PSC that is unable to do so during the Public Witness hearing may file a written statement of position with the PSC at its office, Fourth Floor, Heber M. by facsimile to 801-530-6796. Please indicate that the statement pertains to Docket No. 20-2443-01.

These hearings will be conducted as electronic meetings telephonically, with audio only. While video technology is readily available, the PSC's primary objective is developing an evidentiary record on which to base its decisions. Video technology provides some advantages for a hearing, but also presents additional challenges including generally lower quality audio, higher risk of internet interruptions or other technological complications, and increased potential for a hearing to be compromised by someone with malicious intent. Many participants in PSC hearings have years of experience with audio-only telephonic testimony, and the PSC intends to continue using that technology platform for hearings.

In accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act, individuals needing special accommodations (including auxiliary communicative aids and services) during the hearing or the Public Witness hearing should notify the PSC at 160 East 300 South, Salt Lake City, Utah 84111, (801) 530-6716, at least three working days prior to the applicable hearing.
