Re: **Docket No. 25-2280-03**, In the Matter of Legacy Sweetwater Inc.'s Application for a General Rate Increase, Interim Rate Increase, and Approve New Tariff

Recommendation (Suspend)

The Utah Division of Public Utilities (Division) has reviewed the filing of the request for a rate increase (Application) by Legacy Sweetwater, Inc. (LSI or Company) and concludes that the filing is not complete under Utah Administrative Code R746-700-50.

The Division recommends that the Utah Public Service Commission (Commission) postpone the scheduling conference for this docket until such time that the Company provides a complete filing¹ in accordance with R746-700-50.

Issue

On March 26, 2026, the Commission issued an Action Request for the Division to review and make recommendations concerning LSI's application for a rate increase. Per Utah Code Section 54-7-12(2)(b)(ii), parties have 14 days after the day on which the application is received by the Commission to challenge the completeness of an application.

Discussion

R746-700-50 outlines the filing requirements for a water corporation's general rate case. After reviewing the Company's Application, the Division determined the filing is incomplete. Key missing items include multi-year annual reports and general ledgers, tax returns, debt information, and documentation for infrastructure and future improvement plans. Attachment 1 (Application Details) specifies the unmet requirements and necessary corrective actions. The Division believes the Company can address these gaps and submit a complete filing within 30 days.

Conclusion

The Division recommends that the Commission require LSI to submit the listed items or a justification of why such items are not available within 30 days. Upon receipt of all required documents the Division recommends resuming rate case proceedings and scheduling.

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
