SYNOPSIS

All utility assets having been transferred to quasi-governmental entity, which has assumed responsibility for operating the system, the Commission granted the Petition.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

On August 21, 2001, SILVER SPRINGS WATER COMPANY, a certificated water corporation, sought cancellation of its Certificate of Convenience and Necessity, alleging that all its utility assets had been sold to Mountain Regional Water Special Service District, a quasi governmental entity which has assumed responsibility for operating Petitioner's former system. The Division of Public Utilities, Utah Department of Commerce (DPU) has reviewed the matter and recommended approval. Since a hearing in the matter appears to be entirely superfluous, and there appears to be no detriment to the public interest, we have determined to dispose of the matter summarily and, accordingly, issue the following

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that:

Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 2054, issued to SILVER SPRINGS WATER COMPANY, be, and it is, canceled and annulled effective the date of this Order.

Any person aggrieved by this Order may petition the Commission for review within 20 days of the date of this Order. Failure so to do will forfeit the right to appeal to the Utah Supreme Court.
